

ACC GUIDELINES WERE AMENDED ON AUGUST 13, 2013

All improvements to the exterior of your home are subject to ACC approval. Please make sure to submit a Home

Improvement Request for all exterior improvements, including without limitation:

- Painting (color paint chip must be
- submitted)
- Roofing (must have at least 25 year shingle)
- Fences (new or replacement in whole or part)

Please refer to the Guidelines for all exterior improvements. A plot plan showing the location of your improvement must be submitted with your HIR.

DANGEROUS DOGS

Dogs that meet the following criteria <u>may</u> be declared dangerous:

A dog that makes an unprovoked attack on a person that occurred in a place other than an enclosure in which the dog was being kept;

or

A dog that commits an unprovoked act in a place other than an enclosure in which the dog was being kept and that act would cause a person to reasonably believe that the dog will attack and cause bodily injury.

All dogs and cats, whether considered dangerous or not are prohibited from running loose in Harris County. Owners of loose dogs and cats may be cited by Harris County Sheriff's Deputies or Animal Control for failure to restrain your pet(s) at all times. Fines could run as high as \$500 for this offense.

HOW TO RESTRAIN YOUR PET

- 1. Keep your pet in your house;
- 2. Keep your pet in your fenced in yard;
- 3. Keep your pet on a leash led by a person capable of controlling your pet;
- 4. Keep your pet attached to a line not longer than 6 feet that will keep your pet from entering a public walkway or street.

You know your pet isn't dangerous but the person walking past your house doesn't know that.

PLEASE OBEY THE LEASH LAW AND KEEP YOUR PET(S) RESTRAINED AT ALL TIMES TO AVOID THE POSSIBILITY OF A TICKET RESULTING IN A FINE.

DID YOU KNOW?

May 6, 2014 is "National Teacher's Day"

Remember to thank your child's teacher for all they do. If you are a teacher reading this, we offer our thanks. You are preparing our future.

May 9, 2014 is "Military Spouses Day" -

Created by President Ronald Regan in 1984 Secretary of Defense Casper Weinberger established the Friday before Mother's Day as Military Spouses Day - a day to recognize and honor the real backbone of the military.....the spouses of our soldiers. This day recognizes the contributions made by military spouses to the spirit and well being of soldiers and military communities. Where would military moral be without their spouses behind them?

June 6, 2014 is "National Donut Day"

Established in 1938 by the Chicago Salvation Army to raise much-needed funds during the Great Depression, and to honor the work of World War I Salvation Army volunteers who prepared doughnuts and other foods for thousand of soldiers. The original Salvation Army doughnut was first served in 1917. Today, some donut shops offer free donuts to solicit donations to the Salvation Army.

June 15, 2014 is "Smile Power Day"

Give everyone you see a big friendly, "I like you" smile. You never know, you're warm smile just might turn someone's day right around.....for the good. It's easier to smile than to frown. A smile uses fewer muscles.

June 21 6:51 am is "Summer Solstice"

Solstice, from the Latin for *sun stands still*, in astronomy, either of the two points on the ecliptic that lie midway between the <u>equinoxes</u> (separated from them by an angular distance of 90°).

At the solstices the sun's apparent position on the celestial sphere reaches its greatest distance above or below the celestial <u>equator</u>, about 23 1/2° of arc. At the time of summer solstice, around June 20 or 21, the sun is directly overhead at noon at the <u>Tropic of Cancer</u>.

In the Northern Hemisphere the longest day and shortest night of the year occur on this date, marking the beginning of summer. At winter solstice, about December 22, the sun is overhead at noon at the <u>Tropic of Capricorn</u>; this marks the beginning of winter in the Northern Hemisphere. For several days before and after each solstice the sun appears to stand still in the sky, i.e., its noontime elevation does not seem to change from day to day.
